[Brampton ON] Veteran Folk performer **Glenn McFarlane** is proud and excited to be releasing his latest CD, entitled “**Time to Kill**”. Named after the song by The Band, “**Time to Kill**” is a collection of primarily original songs with special focus on leisure activities such as playing music, playing sports and “Makin’ Chili”. Like his previous CDs, the songs are fun and varied, with musical styles as diverse as folk, blues, rock, country, classical, world music, and even a bit of beatnik jazz/blues. The CD was engineered and co-produced by his Celtelectic bandmate Jon Grant, with assistance from Wendell Ferguson, Tom Leighton and James Gordon, to better capture the diverse musical styles on the album.

The long list of guest musicians on the album includes Grant, Ferguson, Leighton, bandmate Les Smith, and such notables as fiddler Anne Lederman and drummer Howie Southwood of Rawlins Cross. A large group of backing vocalists adds to the fun on many of the pieces.

One highlight of the album is the anthemic singalong “Hey Canada!”. Written in anticipation of Canada’s Sesquicentennial, this infectious ditty is a quirky but heartfelt toast to his native country. Glenn is celebrating his CD release with a series of concerts in Southern Ontario. Highlights include a very special CD Release Concert in Brampton, a radio interview on CFMU Hamilton, two Canada Day appearances, and representing his native province of New Brunswick at the Canterbury Folk Festival in Ingersoll. He will be performing all shows with his brother Keith on percussion and backing vocals, with Jamie Reilly also joining in at the CD Release concert. 2. **East Coast Girls Drink Beer (3:19)**- fun party song with pub ambience
3. **To Be In New Brunswick Once More (3:56)** – reflective East Coast style waltz
4. **Time to Kill (3:54)** – folk-rock arrangement of the song by The Band
5. **Warriors (4:14)** – rock song using the “sports is war” metaphor
6. **Spanish Beethoven (7:46)** – Beethoven Symphony (#7, 2nd movement) arranged for folk instruments, followed by a Latin style instrumental
